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# FEEDBACK ANALYSIS FROM STAKEHOLDERS ON CURRICULUM AND TRANSACTION 2018-19

The Government College for Women (A) has been spearheading to empower the students with holistic development through its Curriculum that aims for academic excellence and employability skills. Feedback reviews and suggestions drawn at regular periods from the Stakeholders- Students, Alumni, and Faculty to strengthen the quality of Education. The College has been insisting on sustaining quality in the realm of academic and administrative area. To exercise this, as part of professional exercise, the IQAC of the college initiates the process of feedback from the stakeholders. This year 2018-2019, the feedback was collected through online forms which are placed in college website from students, Teachers and Alumni on curriculum.

- This information is announced to students in regular meetings / through PA system of the college / announcing in Assembly / through whatsapp groups of classes.
- The link to the feedback form is placed in college website and is also circulated to the teachers through the college whatsapp group.
- The feedback is also collected from alumni. The college through the Alumni whatsapp group solicit feedback from the alumni on important curricular aspects by forwarding the link.
- The IQAC, Academic Council and Board of Studies of various Departments upgrade and improvise the Curriculum keeping in view the consolidated opinions of the Stakeholders.

## FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT ON CURRICULUM FROM STUDENT FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2018-19

The Students' feedback on Curriculum is obtained every academic year as a support system helpful for maintaining the quality in Curriculum. The students' feedback and their Suggestion plays a pivotal role in restructuring the Curriculum in Board of Studies through IQAC and Academic Council.

#### **OBSERVATIONS:**

Based on the data collected from the students the following observations were noted.


- Provision of Syllabus & Announcement of Course Outcomes: Most of the students found the syllabus sufficient (97%). A lesser percentage (1%) of students disagreed, indicating the potential areas for improvement in ensuring all students understand the course expectations fully.
- **Depth & Usefulness of the Course Content:** Most students (97%) find the course content to be deep and useful, which is essential for effective learning. Nonetheless, a negligible percentage disagreed, suggesting the need for refinement in some areas to better meet the needs of all students.
- Applicability & Relevance to Real-Life Situations: There is a strong perception (95%) among students that the course material is relevant and applicable to real-world scenarios, enhancing its value. However, a small percentage disagreed, suggesting potential areas for improvement in reflecting real-life situations.
- Comprehension Level & Understandability of the Units in the Course: The majority (97%) of students perceived the course units to be comprehensible, contributing to effective learning outcomes. Yet, a small percentage disagreed, indicating areas where the course material could be clarified for better understanding.
- Learning Value (Knowledge, Concepts, Skills, Analytical Abilities, Critical Thinking): 96% of the students perceived a high learning value in terms of knowledge acquisition, skill development, and critical thinking enhancement. Nonetheless, a small percentage disagreed, indicating areas for strengthening the course to enhance learning outcomes further.
- Clarity and Relevance of Textual and Reference Material: Most students (96%) fond the textual and reference materials clear and relevant, supporting effective learning. However, a small percentage disagreed, suggesting potential areas for improvement in material clarity and relevance.


- Comprehensive Levels of Syllabus: 96% of students perceived the syllabus to be comprehensive, covering all necessary topics. Still, a small percentage disagreed, indicating areas where the syllabus could be expanded or refined for a more comprehensive understanding.
- Additional Inputs Offered: 95% of the students gave positive feedback regarding the
  additional inputs provided, enhancing the overall learning experience. However, a
  small percentage disagreed, indicating potential areas for further integration of
  additional inputs to enrich the learning experience.
- Extent of Coverage of the Course Within Time Limit: The majority of students (96%) perceive the course to be well-paced within the allocated time frame. Nevertheless, a small percentage disagreed, suggesting potential adjustments to accommodate varying learning paces and needs.
- Quality of Internal Assessment: 96% of students were very much satisfied with the quality and fairness of internal assessments among students. However, ongoing monitoring and alignment with learning objectives are crucial to ensure accurate reflection of student understanding.
- Use of Learning Management System/ICT for Quality Enhancement: Positive feedback (96%) is received regarding the effective use of technology for enhancing learning experiences. Still, a small percentage disagreed, indicating the need for further exploration of technology integration to optimize learning outcomes.
- Adequate Lab Facilities & Hands-On Experience: 95% of students expressed satisfaction regarding the availability and usability of lab facilities. However, ensuring equal access to hands-on experiences and resources for all students is essential for supporting diverse learning needs.
- Library Facilities for the Course: The majority (94%) of students perceived the library facilities to be adequate and beneficial for the course. Yet, ongoing evaluation and improvement of resources and services are necessary to meet evolving student needs effectively.
- Employability of the Course: Positive perception (96%) is noted among students regarding the course's potential to enhance employability. However, continuous alignment with industry demands and practical skill development opportunities are essential for preparing graduates for the workforce effectively.






- Offer supplementary resources or alternative explanations for challenging concepts to support students who may require extra assistance or different learning approaches.

  effectively.































#### 1. Curriculum is student-friendly and skill-oriented.


#### 2. The design motivates the learner to learn and participate.


## 3. Board of studies is taking care to ensure the currency and relevance of the programme offering.


#### 4. Employability is given weightage in curriculum design and development.


#### 5. I have freedom to contribute my ideas on curriculum design and development.


#### 6. The curriculum has been updated from time to time.


#### 7. The admission process adopted by the Institution is effective.


#### 8. The Institution is able to attract meritorious students.


#### 9. Student-centered learning resources are available in the Institution.


#### 10. The faculty has a chance to update their knowledge and skills.


## 11. The administration monitors and encourages the student-centered classwork and preparation of teaching resources.


#### 12. The ambience and working hours of the Library are motivating.

## 13. The Library is a major source of information and offers a variety of sources for research.



#### 14. The teaching aids in the department are sufficient and up-to-date.


