College for Women, Sambasiva Peta, Guntur - 522 001, (Andhra Pradesh) under the UGC autonomous colleges scheme for a period of six year w.e.f. the academic year i.e. 2013-2014 to 2018-2019. **Subject to fulfilling the condition of 'B' Grade accreditation by NAAC.**

The Acharya Nagarjuna University, (A.P.) may now go ahead and issue necessary orders in this regard by endorsing a copy of the same to this office for our records. The admissible grant under this scheme will be released to the College as per its eligibility, according to the norms as laid down in the XIth Plan Guidelines for Autonomous Colleges by the Joint Secretary & Incharge, UGC, South Eastern Regional Office, PB No. 152, APSFC Building, 4th Floor, 5-9-194, Chirag Ali Lane, Hyderabad - 500 001.

This has reference to the proposal submitted by Government College For Women (Autonomous), Sambasiva Pet, Near Naaz Centre, Guntur-522001 Andhra Pradesh, Affiliated To Acharya Nagarjuna University for extension of autonomous status under the UGC Scheme for Autonomous Colleges.

As per the decision of the Standing Committee constituted by University Grants Commission, in its meeting held on 11.02.2021, the Competent Authority has decided to extend the autonomous status to **Government College For Women (Autonomous), Sambasiva Pet, Near Naaz Centre, Guntur-522001 Andhra Pradesh**, affiliated to **Acharya Nagarjuna University** for a period of Five (05) years from the session 2020-2021 to 2024-2025, including ex-post-facto approval for the period 2019-2020, as per provisions of Clause 3.13 and Clause 6.5 of UGC Regulations dated 12.02.2018.

The University is requested to issue necessary notification/order regarding extension of autonomous status to the College as per the UGC (Conferment of Autonomous Status Upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018 for Autonomous Colleges. The College, if eligible, shall apply for autonomy grant as per the norms laid down in the Regulations.

The Autonomous College is required to abide by all the provisions of the UGC Regulations for Autonomous Colleges. The Regulations are available on the UGC website, www.ugu.ac.in. Non compliance of the requirements and conditions in the said Regulations shall attract action as per Clause -14 of the UGC Regulations – 2018. Further, it may be noted that the above said college shall also apply in the prescribed format to University Grants Commission for extension of autonomous status six months prior to the expiry of the autonomous cycle.

Further, your attention is invited to the clause 6.3 of UGC (Conferment of Autonomous Status Upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018 as given below:

Cont...

"The colleges must be accredited by either NAAC with minimum 'A' Grade or by NBA for at least three programme(s) with a minimum score of 675 individually or a corresponding accreditation Grade/score from a UGC empanelled accreditation agency. However, if the number of programme(s) being run by the Institution is less than three, then each of the programmes should secure 675 or more marks. Accreditation status must be valid at the time of application.

Provided further, the existing autonomous colleges will be required to comply with this eligibility condition by 11th February, 2023 as per Clause of 6.3 of UGC, Regulations 2018.

The college is requested to take necessary action accordingly.




Exi Ground Floor Plan (Main Campus)








Plan Showing Proposed Construction of R.C.C.RoofGround & First Floors Building,Womens College Compound,Guntur.



1 These orders shall be in force for a period of one academic year as indicated in the subject, if the College is permitted to function in rented building. The management should renew their affiliation in each academic year until permanent affiliation is granted.

2 The University has the authority and reserves the right to withdraw the affiliation, at any point of time, on any action of the Management / College which damages or causes disrepute to the Government / University and other instrumentality of the State / Central Government.

3 The Management / College shall fulfill the deficiencies within a period of three months and send compliance along with documentary evidence to the University, failing which, the University has authority to withdraw its affiliation.

4 The management should obtain prior approval from the concerned authority for establishment of the College and offering courses etc. before applying for the affiliation, failing which the affiliation accorded is deemed to be cancelled without any further notice.

5 The management shall follow the rules issued by the Government of Andhra Pradesh from time to time on all aspects related to the administration of the college.



- 6 The staff appointed should be qualified as per the rules and regulations issued by UGC or concerned Body.
- 7 Infrastructure like Buildings, Land, Playground, Lab equipment, Library, Furniture etc., should be well maintained for the effective functioning of the College.
- 8 The balance of Corpus Fund, if applicable, should be deposited as per rules in force.
- 9 The management should not change the Programs / Combinations, intake and media etc. sanctioned in these proceedings, failing which, such action will be construed as tampering of records for which the University will initiate necessary legal action against the Management.
- 10 The Management shall neither make any excess admissions without approval of the concerned competent authority and the university nor make admissions without affiliation of the University
- 11 The Management shall publish prospectus of its programs offered and all other institutional details along with fee prescribed.
- 12 If the management is permitted to start the College in a rented building, they should construct permanent building for the College in the same mandal within a period of five years.
- 13 The accommodation shown for the College should not be used for any other purpose other than running the college for which permission is given by such Body and the University.
- 14 The management should not make any claim from the Government or instrumentality of the Government for any grant-in-aid either now or in future, if the College is offering unaided Programs.
- 15 The Management (a) should not shift the College to any other place; (b) should not change the name of the College, (c) should not transfer the management of the College and (d) should not convert Womens College to Co-Education and vice-versa (e) shall not mortgage its assets without prior permission of such Body and the university.
- 16 The management of the College shall set up a grievance and complaints cell as per the Supreme Court / UGC guidelines for dealing with sexual harassment / ragging related cases and other grievances etc.
- 17 The management should establish a website for the college and keep all the necessary academic and administrative information in the website.
- 18 The University reserves the right to conduct surprise checks at any time. The University also reserves the right to cancel affiliation of the college at any stage, if it is found that the documents produced by the management are false, interpolated and improper and the management is not able to run the college as per the norms of the Government and academic stipulations of the University, apart from any defaults/irregularities committed which would attract legal proceedings under Law.
- 19 The Management or any other person of the Management of the College shall not collect any capitation fee and the same is prohibited as per AP Capitation fee Act 1983.
- 20 The Management shall not allow malpractices in the examination and the same is prohibited.
- 21 The Management shall ensure the non-availability of carbonated beverages and junk foods around 200 meters of the premises.
- 22 The Management shall not allow the sale of tobacco products in the premises of the College and the same is prohibited.
- 23 The Management shall take measures to safeguard the interests of the students without any prejudice to their caste, creed, religion, language, ethnicity, gender and disability.
- 24 The Management shall get the College accredited by the State / Central Government agencies, after passing out of two batches or six years whichever is earlier, if the College has not accredited.
- 25 The management of the College shall not affiliate itself to any University outside the State of Andhra Pradesh and run the courses of other State University in their premises under Section 21-A of A.P. Education Act 1982, failing which, the Managements shall face criminal action under Section 21-A of AP Education Act.




